What will you do?

Project HEaRT is a social inclusion platform exclusively for HKU students to join. YOU will have a chance to **join as a BARISTA (咖啡師), a CASHIER at cafe330, or an EVENT PLANNER** to promote healthy living and community support for people with mental disabilities.

What will you gain?

You will have the opportunity to work with vocational trainees from New Life Psychiatric Rehabilitation Association and gain:

- (i) Deeper understanding of people with mental illness and their abilities
- (ii) Knowledge and experience in running social enterprises
- (iii) Work experience and practice in your communication and interpersonal skills
- (iv) Practical insights of running a marketing campaign
- (v) Opportunities to showcase your talents and creativity

How much time is needed?

You will spend a minimum of 2 consecutive hours per week to work at cafe330 between 13 February and 21 April 2017 (except public holidays and Reading Week). The workplace is on-campus and the work schedule can be arranged to fit your own schedule. Visit [here](#) for more details.
